Your task is to create an in-depth presentation about William Shakespeare's life and the Globe Theatre. You will be given time in school to research and prepare your project and then you will present your work to the class. Your project will be peer-assessed based on the criteria outlined below.

You must include evidence of the following in your project:

<i>Criteria</i>	<i>Tick</i>
- <i>Use of original ways to present information and ideas.</i>	
- <i>An understanding that a single source of evidence does not give the full answer to questions about the past.</i>	
- <i>A description of the features of the past including ideas, beliefs, attitudes and experiences of people.</i>	
- <i>An understanding of the concept on continuity and change over time, representing them along with evidence on a <u>timeline</u>.</i>	
- <i>Use of dates and terms accurately in describing events.</i>	
- <i>Use of literacy, numeracy and computing skills to a good standard in order to communicate information about the past.</i>
