They have also been writing play scripts, learning about Boudicca and making their own Roman roads. Their challenge in DT was to design, make and race a Roman chariot.

Science

As part of their Science and DT they have been designing and making a magnetic fishing game. In Science Year 3 completed a scrapheap challenge investigation sorting objects that were magnetic or non-magnetic. They have also been learning about the different layers within soil and created their own edible soil which mostly all quite enjoyed.

A special delivery of 'rocks' came and the class needed to identify the three different types of rock. As part of their science investigators morning they constructed boats to carry passengers to the Arctic, had a confusing cans problem to solve and explored how to keep warm like a walrus with blubber gloves!

English

Environmental Area

This trip was to help the whole class out with their engineering skills, including some of the teachers! They went for the entire day. We were reassured they had a wonderful time and here are Mrs Bull's thoughts about the trip:

Mrs Bull explained "Mazak sponsored our JLR challenge and arranged a visit for all of Year 4 to see their factory and engineering in the real world. Hanson coaches also sponsored the project and provided the transport for the day. It was brilliant! We had a tour of the factory and they kindly gave the teams some things for their displays. The visit gave the children lots of ideas for their future careers."



Superb Science in Year 4

This year, Year 4 have been doing lots of Science including the digestive system and the exciting egg experiment where they put a hardboiled egg in lots of different liquids. The egg represented a tooth so they left it in for 24 hours in different drinks and then saw how it looked. This experiment was to show Year 4 that some liquids were bad for your teeth and some weren't so bad. We were told that a lot of the things surprised them but most of them were a little bit obvious (such as water). Year 4 have also been doing the digestive system. They had to use old clothes and lots more ordinary things to create a replica of the digestive system. They did this experiment to learn how our digestive system works. Charlie (leader of Hyperbolts) explained that they made 19 prototypes before they got to the finished piece.
